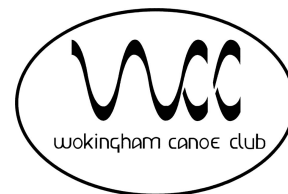

RULES: Are as per 2010 racing handbook. Vertical number plates are required. As per BCU rules for Flat Water Racing, ALL paddlers ranked in Divisions 7, 8, 9, Lightning and Hody must wear buoyancy aids and their use is recommended for all under 16's.

All entrants must prove Comprehensive BCU membership or membership of their Club's registered Youth Section. Otherwise paddlers in Divisions 7, 8, 9 and Lightning/Hody will be charged £2.50 for an Event Ticket/Thames Licence. **Paddlers in Divisions 1 to 6 will be unable to race without a current BCU card.**

HASLER TROPHY: This is a qualifying race for Southern Region.
